be able to bring special gifts to the residents of the Medicine Wheel Nursing Home and we were actually able to give a handmade quilt (donated to us by a precious Amish lady named Sadie) to a couple who were getting married.

Another special "surprise" the Lord had in store for us was finding out that there was another homeless shelter nearby. All of the team felt we should check it out. When we arrived we found that they were almost out of food! They were also in need of different types of supplies, which due to the generous donations we were given, we were able to purchase!

#### **EXPOSING THE NEED -** Tom Fanelli

This was my sixth visit to South Dakota to work on the Native American reservations of Pine Ridge and Cheyenne River. I had been asked to lead the Vision Clinics which were requested by Takini School and the Cheyenne River Youth Project (CRYP). While at CRYP I helped organize their warehouse and prepare for the Winter Clothing Giveaway Program to be held in October. I was also happy to participate in our visits to the Homeless Shelter and the Medicine Wheel Village (a nursing home for seniors) to



provide some much needed food, clothing and supplies.

At the Vision Clinics we examined more than 100 men, women and children and provided many with prescription eyeglasses. However, while there, we also diagnosed many cases of astigmatism. While we were unable to provide eyeglasses to these people, we were able to give the individuals a script and explain why they needed a complete eye exam. Many of the children and youth had never had an eye exam and were not aware they were not seeing clearly. We were able to provide information to their parents or guardians about their need for a follow up through their teachers. Even though we were not able to give out as many eyeglasses as we would have liked, I



considered it a win-win situation since we were able to educate many as to their needs.

Overall I felt Karen and Ken did a great job in scheduling and organizing the trip as we faced many challenges due to Covid-19. The entire team worked together in harmony, whatever the circumstances, and we shared much fellowship and laughter.

#### Is GOD CALLING YOU? - Carol Fanelli

Since I started visiting Cheyenne River Reservation in 2015 I can honestly say God is moving on this reservation! On our first visit we were cautioned not to express our Christian beliefs to the people. This culture had been so threatened by the federal government and early missionaries that they wanted no part of "the white man's God". They were not interested in a God who allowed strangers to take away their children, reduced them to dependency and attempted to wipe out their entire culture. They needed to heal and learn, in their own time, about the goodness, kindness and faithfulness of a God who loved them.

We respected their wishes and worked diligently to show them Christ through our actions. Karen strove to develop strong relationships and build up trust among the people we worked alongside. Her first question was always, "How can we help you in serving your community?" Then, most importantly, she followed through on the needs that were expressed. Whether it was collecting food and supplies for the shelters, toiletries for the nursing home, or school supplies for both students and teachers, Karen brought those needs to everyone she met. And she expressed the love of Christ as she responded.

Today, Karen and Ken are considered "family" on the reservation and are truly welcomed with joy when they arrive. They are a small piece of the plan God has for restoring these people to Him. We can see a difference over these past six years. Many people express a belief in Christ and others are open to prayer for healing in their lives. Our God is faithful and long suffering, desiring that all would learn of His love and the healing it brings.

We were pleased to be the hands and feet of Christ on this trip. We shared much laughter but lots of tears at the poverty and desperation that our brethren on the reservation face. We ask you to join us in prayer that God would continue to move mightily in this place and replace despair with hope. We thank you for your past support but there is so much more that needs to be done. Is God calling you to help?





## Look at What We Accomplished Thanks to Your Support !!

At the **Cheyenne River Youth Project** we hosted a Vision Clinic, organized the warehouse and helped prepare for the Winter Clothing Give-away. We also cooked meals for the children, organized the dorm linen closet, and organized boxes of food donations to make them more easily accessible to volunteers preparing food boxes.

At the **Medicine Wheel Village** we donated home made lap blankets, prayer shawls, and blankets. We also left Blessing Bags full of toiletries for each resident, as well as craft supplies for group activities.

At the **Elderly Nutrition Services Agency** we provided warm hats, gloves, socks and scarves to distribute to seniors.

At the **Old Agency Emergency Homeless Shelter** we donated warm hats, gloves, socks and scarves. We also supplied paper supplies and staples, and a large enough assortment of meat to provide healthy meals for several weeks. At the **Takini School** we hosted a Vision Clinic for every student in the school. We also provided a Blessing Bag for each student full of warm hats, scarves, gloves and socks along with school supplies, books, and small toys or jewelry.

#### At the Cheyenne River Veterans Association we

donated about 700 pounds of canned meat, soups, fruit, and crackers etc. We also donated warm hats, gloves, socks and blankets.
