WE ARE ALL BROTHERS AND SISTERS - Karen Moore, Team Leader

From the time I was a child I have always wanted to help people. When I accepted the Lord at thirteen that desire only became stronger.

I began my relationship with the Cheyenne River Youth Project and the people of the Cheyenne River Indian Reservation in 2015, and have made ten trips to the Reservation since then.

The relationship between We're All God's Children, of which I am one of the representatives, and the Youth Project, Takini School, the Homeless Shelter and the Veterans Food Bank has grown deeper each visit.

Each visit we are amazed at the progress we have seen at each of these places! The Youth Project has grown in many ways. The training they offer the youth in growing indigenous foods, and learning art and computer skills is amazing. They have increased the numbers of interns among the teens quite a lot. We found them to be respectful and helpful as we worked alongside many of them during our trip. The Old Agency Homeless Shelter continues to function for another year thanks to the Tribal Council. Iny Hale is the director of the shelter and does a wonderful job keeping the shelter clean and running efficiently. Feeding American continues to fill the Veterans Food Bank with needed supplies for the veterans, and Takini School has weathered the storm of winter weather and COVID.

For me one of the high points of the trip was working with my granddaughter in the kitchen with Iddy, the head cook for the Youth Project. No matter how many challenges Iddy met each day, she was happy and fun to work with. Together we made one hundred loaves of Pumpkin Bread! Being able to reestablish friendships with many old friends also made my heart happy.

In the afternoons we enjoyed fun activities with the children ages 6-10 which we prepared

every evening. Every day after these activities we made them supper. Each day they enjoyed special treats, and we even had a big birthday party for them, serving pizza, chips and of course lots of cupcakes! At the Homeless Shelter we delivered sheets, towels, backpacks, hygiene products and food! They were so grateful, and, as we could see, they were in great need of these items. There are so many homeless on the reservation, it is heartbreaking.

For me, however, the moment I will never forget was when a little boy of eight sat down beside me one afternoon after eating the supper we prepared. He said "Aren't we all brothers and sisters?" I said of course we are. "Yes, he said, I mean I heard we all came from a man and a woman long ago." I replied that those people were Adam and Eve, and that they were the father and mother of us all.

"Then why are we all different colors I wonder?" he asked. That took me aback for a moment. "Well, I replied, people in Africa are in the sun a lot, so their skin is very brown, people in China have yellower skin because they live where they don't have as much sun." This seemed to satisfy him, he was thoughtful for a moment then he pulled my sleeve up and his own.

"Look, we are almost the same color aren't we." he said.

"Well, yes. We are," I replied! There you see, he said, "I guess we really are all brothers and sisters!"

This was a moment I will never forget.

he was walking near a cliff and decided to jump off and commit suicide. He said something told him to come to the "Main", which is the name of the building where we were staying. I was able to talk to him a long time and helped him understand that God would not want him to do this. I just knew that was why I came on this trip, and it made me so thankful. From that point on he was at the door when we came out in the morning and stayed with me most of the day, 'till bedtime. I would sneak him out a coke now and then, although Mimi didn't care at all, and we gave him special treats during the day.

I would recommend this trip to anyone who has a heart for missions, or any person my age who is ready to work, and to create a lasting relationship with people who are just wonderful.


GOD WORKS THROUGH HIS PEOPLE - Teri Hope

If you feel called by the Lord to join another outreach, please listen and go. You will be blessed and surely humbled.


