Even the simple act of crocheting or knitting warm hats, scarves and lap blankets can bring smiles to lots of faces. ## NATIVE AMERICANS

Once, their nation was proud and strong. Now, they are the poorest of America's poor. Native Americans living on reservations are the most impoverished people in our nation.

Beginning in 2008, We're All God's Children sent teams to Pine Ridge Reservation in South Dakota offering free vision screenings and eyeglasses along with medical supplies, books and hats for the children. The Pine Ridge Reservation has been designated as one of the poorest areas in the United States. The Reservation has few natural resources and no industry.

We are now offering our services to the Cheyenne River Reservation, also in South Dakota. In addition to vision screenings, we have helped purchase much needed school supplies, hats, gloves and socks, and provided equipment for after school programs. We do this by working with Native run organizations and tribal schools.

Recently we began working with the Cheyenne River Veterans Association to provide food and other essential items to the homeless veteran population from the Cheyenne River Sioux Tribe.

Our goal is to partner with those on the reservation who are already making a difference by inspiring hope, pride and a new vision to the youth of this generation. We invite you to join us as we come alongside those who are making positive changes to our brothers and sisters right here in the United States.



## AFRICA

We are all aware there are many needs throughout the continent of Africa. Since WAGC was founded in 2005, we have been working in several small rural villages in Kenya and Zambia. This work has been incredibly successful, as we joined God in the work He was already doing. With the help of our supporters thousands of people in Africa have been helped through free medical and dental clinics, vision screenings, and women's health education seminars.



We have also helped fund the installation of wells, latrines, and brick school buildings as well as taught life skills by starting a carpentry class, and funding sewing machines for tailoring classes. These classes help the men and women in the villages earn a living for their families.

In addition, we taught the school teachers many new methods for keeping their classes engaged and how to use their limited resources to the best of their abilities.

Perhaps most importantly, we have brought the Gospel to many men, women, and children by not only showing the love of Christ but by teaching classes and individuals about the forgiveness and gift of eternal life provided to all by the death and resurrection of our Savior, Jesus Christ.

## EL SALVADOR

Esther's Heart Ministry (EHM) is our service partner on the ground in El Salvador. Founded by Beth Algeria, a missionary from Lancaster, PA, the ministry offers help and hope to desperately poor children living in the communities of San Salvador. Their main goals are to bring these children into God's family, provide them with basic necessities, and to raise up a generation who will minister to others in every corner of El Salvador.

They do this by supplying food, education and healthcare to the poorest children in San Salvador. They also provide safe and fun activities for the children and youth such as English classes, Bible classes, and summer camps. Our goal is to support EHM by providing financial assistance for some of their special programs and sending short term mission teams to support the activities of their hardworking staff.
